Letter from the 2d Regiment.

The late battle. [A friend allows us to print the following private letter, which was written by one who was in the battle at Manassas...]

"At this late day, amid the thousand and one exciting things I have had to think of, I am wholly unable to tell whether I have written you since the great battle or not."

I was on guard Saturday last (20th July) at our camp near Bull Run. At 2 A. M. of Sunday we started on our march. There were the same long lines of soldiers that I have before spoken of, but this morning we took different roads.

We are glad to learn from various sources that our prisoners in the hands of the rebels at Manassas and Richmond are well taken care of, and that the sick and wounded are treated with every kindness.

Most of our officers who were taken, and many of our wounded were sent to Richmond, and an officer who escaped from Manassas and arrived here last Monday, states that the latter were taken into private houses there and received the most tender care.

The Killing of D. H. Whitney.

The Woodstock Standard gives the following incidents of the assassination of Dana H. Whitney, of that town, near Newport News on the 23d ult.

"In a company with Aug. Becker, Quartermaster of Col Bendix's regiment, he started from Newport News, mounted on a mule, with the intention of visiting Hampton, which is about seven miles distant."
