FATHER: CORPUS HONOR, July 18th.
To give you some account of our life in the main camp, I will only give a hasty sketch of the day of the 1st of August, which is the day of the battle of Bull Run. We engaged the enemy at 10 o'clock, and fought until 4 o'clock. The only thing which I think is worthy of our story there is our being to be considered as the first of our kind in the history of the war.
